

YOUTH SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

The Youth Summer Reading Challenge is free to children from birth through fifth grade. Participants will receive rewards based on the number of books read, or the number of books read to them. For longer books they may be logged each time an hour is spent reading them. Prizes will be awarded from a minimum of 5 to a maximum of 20.

GUIDELINES – ONLINE REGISTRATION

- 1. Register online at **www.fortbendlibraries.gov** by clicking on the image for the 2025 Youth Summer Reading Challenge, on or after MAY 26.
- 2. Participants are responsible for logging their own titles online.
- 3. Please record titles of books on your online reading log before coming to the library to collect rewards.
- 4. Rewards can be claimed at the library beginning JUNE 2.
- 5. One trophy per child per summer
- 6. Last date to pick up trophies AUG 30, 2025.


