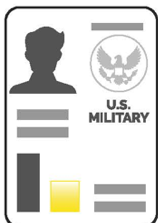

My photo ID expired :

If you are 18-69 years old: you may use an ID that **may have expired for up to 4 years.**

If you are 70 or older: **you may use an expired photo ID.**

Does the address on my photo ID have to match my voter registration address? No

NOTE: The name on your photo ID should match your voter registration card OR be "substantially similar."

You can vote with a regular ballot if you cannot reasonably obtain a photo ID.

Registered voters without photo ID who can't reasonably obtain one can fill out a *Reasonable Impediment Declaration*, and show a copy or original of 1 of the following documents with the voter's name & address:

- Texas Voter Registration Card
- a government document showing the voter's name & address. Examples: driver's license from another state; expired Texas driver's license;
- current utility bill;
- bank statement;
- government check;
- paycheck; or
- **(a)** certified domestic birth certificate or **(b)** court admissible birth document (which may include a foreign birth document).

NOTE: Voters with a past felony conviction may register to vote if they have fully discharged their sentence, including incarceration, parole & probation, or have been pardoned.

Forgot your ID?

✓ **(1) Get your ID & Return** to the polling place. *OR*

(2) Vote, using a *PROVISIONAL ballot*. However, if you want the Provisional Ballot to be counted, you must bring acceptable photo ID to the County Voter Registrar's office – within 6 calendar days.

Voter Harassment

- **Election officials cannot** question a voter about the use of an ID type
- **Poll watchers may never** question a voter about Voter ID

My voter registration Status says "Suspense" → You can still vote.

"Suspense" likely means that your county voter registrar needs to confirm your address. Contact your County Voter Registrar before the voter registration deadline.

Voting using a Limited Ballot

If you have moved to a new county & haven't registered in the new county by the registration deadline, you might be eligible to vote a Limited Ballot **during the Early Voting period**. Contact the County Voter Registrar or Elections Office in your new county.

Get an application to vote by mail if

(1) you're out of the county during ALL of early voting and on election day;

(2) you're 65 or older;

(3) you have a disability, sickness, or physical condition that prevents appearing in person without the likelihood of needing personal assistance or of injuring your health; or (4) you are expecting to give birth within 3 weeks before or after Election Day.
