

This month's featured resource is a title from the American Bar Association. Model Witness Examinations 4th edition is the most up to date version of a classic handbook that will show you how to effectively deal with practical evidentiary issues that every trial lawyer faces. The models cover a broad variety of basic issues that must be dealt with in direct, cross, and redirect, as well as in the use of interrogatories and depositions. Each model starts with a description of a fact situation and is followed by the examination in Q &A format. After each model, the authors provide an analytical commentary in which they cite and explain the key cases, rules, secondary authorities, and provide tactical and strategic guidance. This



This Month's Featured Technology: Internet Legal Research on a Budget: Free and Low Cost Resources for Lawyers (Book)

This month we are looking at free and low cost internet resources for lawyers who cannot afford to depend on expensive legal research databases. The authors share the top websites, apps, blogs, Twitter feeds, and crowdsourced resources that will save you time and money. This book will help you locate and use: Legal Portals and directories, Case law databases including Casemaker and Fastcase, Cite-checking resources, Dockets, Federal Statutory research, Federal, legislative, and congressional materials. Also, starting points for state, local, territorial, and tribal

Texas Case Law Update

Local Cases

- Mattias v. Gilbert, No. 14-16-00640-CV, (May 16, 2017): dismissed. (400th Dist.)
- Cox, Quentin, No. PD-0329-17, (May 17, 2017): PDR refused. (434th Dist.)
- Williamson v. State, No. 01-16-00001-CR, (June 1, 2017): aff'd TC judgment. (268th Dist.)
- Catt v. Dolozier & et al, No. 14-16-00524-CV, (June 1, 2017): aff'd. (268th Dist.)
- State v. Barahona, No. 14-17-00135-CR, (June 1, 2017): dismissed. (400th Dist.)
- <u>Texas Education Agency v. S.E.H.</u>, No. 01-16-00420-CV, (June 6, 2017): rev'd TC judgment and render judgment. (268th Dist.)
- <u>Coleman v. Catalyst Property Solutions</u>, No. 01-17-00119-CV, (June 8, 2017): appeal dismissed. (CCL #1)
- Smith v. Citibank, No. 01-16-00955-CV, (June 13, 2017): dismiss appeal. (CCL # 2)

Family Law

- Matter of V.G., 513 S.W.3d 815 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2017): it was affirmed that there was justification for officer to pat down juvenile for weapons.
- In Re Guardianship of Tonner, 514 S.W.3d 242 (Tex. App.—Amarillo 2014): it was within the discretion of the court to not to dispense with or modify guardianship.

Criminal Law

- Williams v. State, 513 S.W.3d 619 (Tex. App.—Fort Worth 2016): since the defendant voluntarily went to the police station with officers for an interview after the death of her husband was determined to not be in custody.
- Knott v. State, 513 S.W.3d 779 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2017): the identification of the victim was sufficiently reliable even though the one-person show up procedure was suggestive.
- Barnett v. State, 513 S.W.3d 596 (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 2016): it was determined that the defendant's right to trial was not violated due to the finding that the trial court door was closed even though it was testified that the door had been locked.

Estate Planning and Probate—Wills

Byerley v. McCulley, 514 S.W.3d 426 (Tex. App.—Tyler 2017): The savings clause which allowed notice by posting for a probate of will of person who died prior to a specific date was repealed.

Torts—Experts

• Hospadales v. McCoy, 513 S.W.3d 724 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist] 2017): the orthopedic surgeon was qualified to give testimony as an expert on injuries in a car accident.
