## Featured Resource: Law Library Print Resources By Jonathan Briggs

Since the Law Library has been going through renovation since the end of March, we wanted to remind our patrons of what we have on offer both in books and online. We have a compact yet comprehensive and deep collection of books and other printed publications focusing on Texas and related law. Our printed collection includes: Vernon's Texas statutes, Texas cases from the southwest reporter; Texas Jurisprudence and Corpus Juris Secundum; Matthew Bender publications including Dorsaneo's Litigation Guide, Criminal Practice Guide, Family Law Practice & Procedure and more. We also have the full collection of the O'Connor's series; Texas Pattern Jury Charges; the Texas Practice Guide series; West's Texas Forms; James Publishing's materials; and numerous other individual publications concerning criminal law, estate and probate, family law, civil litigation, and many other topics and areas of the law. On the federal side we have: Supreme Court case reporters; the U.S. Code Annotated; Federal Practice and Procedure; Collier on Bankruptcy; and individual publications on areas such



as intellectual property, criminal law, and immigration. The library subscribes many Texas' law school journals as well as other legal magazines/journals and periodicals of general interest such as newspapers and magazines. For the pro se patron, we have many self-help publications, including the Nolo series which covers a number of topics such as financial issues, landlord-tenant, and family law. We strive to maintain a collection of printed materials that fully serves our patrons. To that end, we are open to consider suggestions from patrons for additions to the library collection. This Month's Featured Technology: Current and Coming Digital Resources



The Law Library's online and digital materials are substantial via our subscriptions to Westlaw, Lexis Advance, O'Connor's Online, James Publishing Digital Forms, HeinOnline, Erisman's Reversible Errors on CD, and the State Bar Manuals and Pattern Jury Charges in PDF. These resources provide access to federal cases from the Supreme Court, 5th Circuit, and Texas District Courts; all Texas cases; all Texas and federal statutes; numerous practice guides; forms; commentaries; scholarly journals; and much more. Many of these we also have in print and a few we do not. Further, the website Texas Law Help continues to be a major source of standard forms

for our pro se patrons for family law matters and other issues. In addition to these resources which we will continue to have, we are adding some unique resources to Westlaw coming in October. Our jurisprudence and practice guides collections on Westlaw will expand from only Texas to include all states. In addition, we will finally have Corpus Juris Secundum online for those needing to quickly print off a section. For those who do not need these additional jurisdictions, we are also going to be including court filings, trial court orders, briefs, jury verdicts, and more for our Texas only attorneys. Finally, the database will now add the public records search, company investigator, crime records, and real property reports that many patrons have been asking about. In addition to all of this, we will be adding a fourth terminal for Westlaw access as well as you can access the database through your device as long as you are within the Law Library and connected to our wifi. #### **Criminal Law**

- Albert L. Love v. State of Texas, 543 S.W.3d 835 (Tex.Crim.App. 2016, reh'g. denied): Defendant was convicted of capital murder and sentenced to death. Defendant had filed a motion to suppress evidence (cell phone records/text messages) contending they were seized without a warrant supported by probable cause. The motion was denied by the trial court and the records were admitted. The Court of Criminal Appeals found that the impact on the jury of the improperly admitted text messages was great and the Court could not say beyond a reasonable doubt that the text messages did not contribute to the jury's guilty verdict. The Court held the error was not harmless. Reversed and remanded for a new trial.
- Alvaro A. Lopez v. State of Texas, 544 S.W.3d 499 (Tex.App.-Houston [14th Dist], 2018, no pet. h.): Defendant was convicted of murder and sentenced to 60 years. On appeal Defendant challenged his conviction on the ground that the Court did not give a punishment mitigation charge for defendant's voluntary intoxication during the commission of the crime. Defendant claimed that he did not recall what he had done and that the Court on its own motion/sua sponte should have provided a punishment charge on temporary insanity due to voluntary alcohol intoxication. Defendant made no such motion at trial. Court found that this type of instruction is defensive and is waived if not sought. Further, even if he had sought the instruction or if the Court did have a duty to issue it sua sponte, the mere fact that he was intoxicated, even if extremely so, or had a lack of memory is not sufficient for this type of instruction. No error found to exist in the charge. Affirmed.
