

# **Technology Corner**

Despite the closures, limitation of services, and social distancing in response to COVID-19, Law Library staff has remained committed to being responsive to our patrons. As of Monday, May 4, 2020 the Law Library has re-opened with normal business hours though with some





restrictions. At this time, only attorneys and county staff are allowed inside the Law Library. Admitted visitors will be limited to one hour only so as to allow as many as possible to use our resources such as computers and tables (subject to availability of course), with a maximum of five total visitors at any given time. Only five of our ten computers are available for use to keep patrons spread out. One of these computers has the Westlaw legal database, another has the Lexis Advance database, and one computer has both. In light of current events Westlaw is offering up to 20 hours of free access through June 30, 2020, to facilitate working from home or office. Similarly Lexis is offering a free 30 day access. Please contact the Law Library for sign-up information. For any patron be they an attorney, county employee, or member of the general public, we are glad to do as much as possible remotely to help you, such as e-mailing forms, information, or other materials. As always, the TexasLawHelp website (www.texaslawhelp.org) is an indispensable resource for some standard forms and information, especially in the area of family law, and is accessible for free from any home or office computer. Circumstances can change from week-to-week and day-to-day concerning our services. We expect to fully re-open to all patrons in the near future, though of course with continuing health and safety protocols. We will keep you updated. #### Criminal Law

Suzanne E. Wexler v. The State of Texas, 593 S.W.3d 772 (Tex.App.-Houston[14th Dist.] 2019, pet. filed): A home was the subject of surveillance regarding drug sales. Based on traffic stops of vehicles that had gone to the home yielding meth, officers assisted by the Harris Co. Sheriff's High Risk Operations Unit (HROU) raided the home pursuant to a search warrant. Defendant/Appellant was instructed via loudspeaker to come out with her hands up. She complied, was placed in the backseat of a police vehicle, and was considered a suspect. While the HROU was doing a protective sweep the primary officer spoke with Ms. Wexler while she was in the patrol car, stating: "Hey, we have a search warrant. We're going to find the drugs. Just tell me where they are." She told him. Drugs, baggies, cash, and a gun were found. She was arrested. At trial she objected to the admission of her response to the officer's inquiry arguing that the statement should be excluded because prior to making it she was not read the Miranda warnings as required by Section 38.22 of the Code of Crim. Proc., which was overruled. She was found guilty and sentenced to 25 years. The 14th Court stated that compliance with Miranda is only invoked when the statement is made during a custodial interrogation. In analyzing the facts under an objective-man standard, they found she was not in custody at the time of the questioning and affirmed the trial court. The dissenting justice reached the opposite conclusion and would have reversed and remanded with the statement excluded (that statement was the only evidence that tied her to the drugs. A petition for discretionary review was filed on March 19, 2020. It will be interesting to see what, if anything, the Court of Criminal Appeals does with this case.
